The Austin Flute Choir is part of the Austin Flute Society and is composed of members from the Austin, TX metro area.

The Dirty River Jazz Band is a traditional style jazz band from San Antonio, TX. The first band members met at Texas Lutheran Univ. in Seguin, TX. After a concert put on by San Antonio's own Jim Cullum, Chris Alvarado and Kris Vargas put a similar group together. Their first public performance was under a gazebo on the square of downtown Seguin where they instantly started turning heads. They have gone on to perform at a number of private and corporate events, and at venues around the U.S.

The Marcel Moyse Society is devoted to continuing the legacy and pedagogy of flutist Marcel Moyse. moysesociety.org

The Trescendo Trio was founded in 2022 to advocate for the unique chamber grouping of flute, saxophone, and piano by exploring diverse repertoire and compositional styles. Kristin Grant (she/her) is a freelance flutist from Hot Springs, AR, who teaches at Southern Arkansas Univ. Caroline Taylor (she/her) is dean of the School of Performing Arts and professor of saxophone at Ouachita Baptist Univ. The United States Army Old Guard Fife and Drum Corps is stationed at Joint Base Myer-Henderson Hall, VA. As the only unit of its kind in the armed forces, the Corps acts as the Official Escort to the President and has participated in every Presidential Inaugural Parade since 1961.

The Universal Jazz Flute Big Band (formerly The Universal Virtual Jazz Flute Big Band) was founded in the midst of the pandemic in 2021 by Yuko Hoshi of Tokyo, Japan, as a brand new form of flute big band that anyone from anywhere can join. From the monthly online rehearsals including jazz study opportunities, the band has created several virtual ensemble videos, available on YouTube.
