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



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#### 2024 Lifetime Achievement Award

### **Trudy Kane**

**Trudy Kane** was Principal Flute with The Metropolitan Opera from 1976 to 2008, and is Associate Professor Emeritus at the Frost School of Music, University of Miami, where she taught from 2008 to 2019. She received both her BM and MM from The Juilliard School.

Kane spent her early career as a sought-after freelance musician, acting as a regular substitute with the New York Philharmonic, recording movie music and jingles with well-known studios, and substituting and touring with The Met. Kane can be heard performing on numerous movie soundtracks including *The Untouchables* and the 1991 Disney animated *Beauty and the Beast*.

In 1976, Kane began her career at The Met, and won the principal flute audition in March of 1977, becoming the first woman in the company's history to hold the title. Kane went on to have a successful 32-year tenure there, working with the world's greatest conductors and singers.

As an arranger and transcriber, Kane has published a number of works for flute ensemble, flute quartet, and solo flute, including a transcription of Act 2 of Puccini's *La Boheme*, Intermezzo to Act 3 of Puccini's *Manon Lescaut*, Smetana's *Overture to the Bartered Bride*. Her flute quartets include *Carmen for Four*, Gossec's *Tambourin*, Rimsky-Korsakov's *Flight of the Bumble Bee*, and the final trio from R. Strauss's *Der Rosenkavalier*. She's also published cadenzas for Mozart's Flute Concerto in D Major and a transcription of Fauré's Sonata in A Major, Op 13.

She has recorded a solo CD, *In the French Style*, and can be both seen and heard in many of the *Met Opera on Demand* performances including *La Boheme*, *Il Trittico*, *Manon Lescaut*, and *Peter Grimes*.

In 2008 Kane transitioned to academia as Associate Professor of Flute at the Frost School of Music. She cultivated a very strong studio with many former students going on to major positions and established the Frost Flute Ensemble, which performed at multiple state and national music conventions. A champion of new music, Kane commissioned several pieces for the Frost Flute Ensemble including Thomas Sleeper's Concerto for Flute and Flute Orchestra, Dorothy Hindman's *Mechanisms*, and Lansing McLoskey's *que la tierra se partió por su sonido*. Additionally, Thomas Sleeper's Sonata for Flute and Piano and Valerie Coleman's *Matisseries* for solo flute were written for Kane during this time. In 2015 the Frost School commissioned Ellen Zwillich's *Concerto Elegia* for her as well, which she premiered and recorded with Thomas Sleeper and the Frost Symphony Orchestra. Kane was the 2015 recipient of the Frost School of Music's Phillip Frost Award for Excellence in Teaching and Scholarship.

Trudy Kane is a Yamaha Artist.


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#### 2024 Lifetime Achievement Award

### **David Straubinger**

David Straubinger improved the lives of flutists everywhere when he developed the Straubinger Pad. From his teens, he demonstrated his giftedness, both musically and in his ability to detect and repair malfunctioning instruments. He began his musical training on the piano, went on to briefly play the flute, but ultimately landed on the oboe. His talent took him first to the Jordon School of Music, and then on to The Juilliard School. From there Straubinger began a career playing oboe with The Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, which at the time kept a 36-week season. This shorter season allowed him time to flex his technical muscles. In 1969 he set up a repair shop in his home, and residing just 36 miles north of Indiana University, music students began to bring him their instrumental problems. As a professional musician with a genius for repair, his reputation spread like wildfire.

As David worked with each of the instruments, his goal was to hand back to the musician the absolute best quality repair job possible. However, there was one instrument for which he never felt completely satisfied: the flute. While he could repair many instruments and not see the owners again for years, the flutists came in time after time, even with brand new flutes. As the weakest tone generator of all wind instruments, Straubinger knew that the flute required the most precisely positioned tone holes and pads, the latter of which were often extremely unstable. His dedication to solving that problem ultimately led him to develop properly functioning pads and tone holes, as well as the tools to make his system operate optimally.

By 1989 Straubinger had developed and patented his pad that dramatically improved the way flutes performed. He reached out to Brannen Brothers Flutemakers in Boston, which he understood to have a vision for high-quality flute construction. Brannen offered him a three-year exclusive on the pads and helped him set up his own flute company. Straubinger Flutes was born.

As the business grew, Straubinger realized that with the mass distribution of Straubinger Pads he needed to provide detailed instruction on the implementation of his system to insure optimal performance. He began teaching certification courses in his own shop, as well as traveling around the world to demonstrate how to use his tools and techniques.

Today, Straubinger Flutes includes his son and master repair technician Joel, and is managed by his music-and-business-minded wife, Dale. The Straubinger Pad, which allows for incredible speed and precise feedback, has opened a new world of exploration and creative possibilities for flutists worldwide. The Straubinger Flute, with the same world-class standards, are played by greats such as Thomas Robertello and Jasmine Choi.

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#### 2024 Distinguished Service Award

### **Leonard Garrison**

Leonard Garrison has served the NFA in many capacities, all with distinction: President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, Program Chair, Chair of the Advisory Council, Chair of Past Presidents' Council, Chair of the Long-Range Planning Committee and Chair of the Advisory Committee. He has served on an array of committees including Nominating, Endowment, Flutist Quarterly Editorial Advisory Board, and Archives and Oral History. He also was a member of the task force charged with updating Selected Flute Repertoire and Studies: A Graded Guide in 2020—and also wrote its French translation! His frequent contributions to The Flutist Quarterly include 14 published articles, 24 reviews, and much more.

During his tenure as NFA President (2008–10), he led the way for a host of initiatives: establishing new committees (Low Flutes, Career Development, and Business of Music Committees), the Frances Blaisdell Fund, and the Flute Choir Composition Competition; re-formed the Commercial Members Committee; led the writing of a new strategic plan; increased commercial underwriting; and initiated many cost-cutting measures including restructuring competition rotation and moving certain things online.

A fierce advocate for the commissioning of new works for the flute and piccolo, Garrison has worked tirelessly over the decades through his leadership in the NFA to bring new repertory to life. In addition, 21 works have been either commissioned, co-commissioned, or written for him. His edition of the Telemann *Fantasias* won the NFA Newly Published Music Competition in 2021, and this year Oxford University Press will publish his eagerly-awaited book, *Gaston Crunelle and Flute Playing in Twentieth-Century France*.

Garrison and his wife, clarinetist Shannon Scott, have also created a successful and fruitful musical partnership. They began performing recitals as the Scott/Garrison Duo at Northwestern University in 1988, joined the Tulsa Philharmonic as full-time musicians in 1988 and 1989 respectively, and were 2016 prizewinners of The American Prize and winners of the NFA Chamber Music Competition.

He still plays on the flute he had in college, a beloved Powell made by Fenwick Smith, #4985, with its original headjoint. He has studied with Robert Willoughby, Sam Baron, Wally Kujala, Jack Wellbaum, Richard Graef, Bill Hebert, and Brian Gordon. He has recorded 12 critically acclaimed CDs on major labels and has long been a champion of the music of Elliott Carter. He has performed as a soloist throughout the U.S., Canada, France, and China, and played flute and piccolo in the Chicago Symphony Orchestra (sub), Civic Orchestra of Chicago, Spokane Symphony (sub), and Tulsa Philharmonic.

Garrison is now Emeritus Professor (former University Distinguished Professor and Associate Director) in the Lionel Hampton School of Music at the University of Idaho.

#### **Rules and Policies**

The first two rows of each convention room are designated priority seating for attendees with disabilities. Please consider refraining from using these rows, and if you are seated in this area, please be prepared to offer your seat if another attendee requires it.

Please be courteous to the performers and those around you when taking photographs at concerts or presentations. Ensure that your camera's flash and any associated sounds (e.g., from a cell phone) are turned off.

Audio and video recording of convention concerts and presentations is discouraged, unless the person recording:

- will not block the view of any person in the audience, create noise, or otherwise interrupt, disturb, disrupt, or delay the performance or presentation being recorded;
- will not use said recording for any copyright infringing or other illegal purpose or for any purpose that would be detrimental to the NFA.

Please silence all electronic devices before performances or presentations.

In accordance with NFA policy, refrain from applause at all competition events.

Rehearsals will take place in the performance halls between events. Please do not disturb them. Doors will open 15 minutes prior to the event.

Please refrain from practicing in hotel rooms after 9 p.m.

Please observe policies as a courtesy to all the performers and attendees.

#### **Instrument Security Room**

Convention registrants are advised not to leave instruments unattended in their hotel rooms and not to carry them (or any conspicuous valuables) outside the hotel unless absolutely necessary.

A secure room with 24-hour access (as long as the Convention Center is open for business) is located in room #216 B at the Henry B. González Convention Center. The security room is available for checking instruments starting Wednesday, July 31, at 3 p.m. and ending Sunday, August 4, at 8 p.m.

Registrants may take instruments in or out as needed, 24 hours a day or when the Convention Center is open for business.

This service ends at 8 p.m. Sunday, August 4, 2024. All instruments must be picked up by that time.

#### **Procedure for Checking Instruments**

All registered convention attendees may use the instrument security room free of charge. When you check your bag, you will be given a tag/receipt combination. On the tag, write your name as it appears on your badge and your room number at the hotel or a number at which you can be reached. Each time you check your bag, the guard will hand you the receipt portion of this ticket. This will be for one case unless you open the case and request a receipt specifying the contents of the case. It is strongly suggested that you take a picture of the tag in case it gets lost. To claim your instrument, you must present your receipt and be wearing your convention badge; the name printed on the tag must match the badge of the person picking up the bag and you must have a picture ID. Since many flute cases look identical, it will be helpful to attach an identifying item (e.g., brightly colored scarf, pom-pom, toy key chain) to help the guards find yours more quickly.

We hope the knowledge that your instruments are secure will free you to enjoy the convention to the fullest. All items not picked up by 8 p.m. on Sunday, August 4, 2024, will be turned over to the Henry B. González Convention Center Lost and Found for pickup. Contact the Lost and Found at 833-246-5155. The Convention Center and the NFA will not guarantee security for any items delivered to Lost and Found.




#### **Convention Center Maps**




### Directions from the Marriott Hotels to the Convention Center

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




